#### Silver Jubilee Celebrations - Commemorating milestones

Saint Paul's School, Rajkot, marked its Silver Jubilee Celebrations with a spectacular two-day extravaganza on 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> December 2024.

### Saint Paul's School MUN-Facilitating collaboration, dialogue and diplomacy!

The school hosted the 8th edition of its MUN Conference for the students of Classes 7 to 12 on 24th and 25th January 2025. The Conference was organized in association with SkillSphere Education. The event was inaugurated with the lighting of the lamp by the Chief Guest Dr. Pratik Shah, Urologist, Sterling Hospital- Rajkot, Rev. Fr. James, Principal, Saint Paul's School, Mr. Aadit Khanna from SkillSphere and one of the student representatives. 346 students from 7 reputed schools of Rajkot participated as delegates in the MUN under various committees like the United Nations World Tourism Organization, United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues and the All India Political Parties Meet. The stimulating MUN sessions saw the delegates utilize their skills of introduction, opinion development, debating, collaborative problem solving and drafting resolutions. The dedicated involvement of the organizing committee, volunteers and the delegates was recognized during the closing ceremony. The winning delegates were given certificates by the Principal.



#### Annual Pauline's Day- Grades 3 to 5-Showcasing research and creativity!

The fascinating world of insects formed the heart of the showcasing titled 'Insectopedia' presented by the students of Grade 3 on 29<sup>th</sup> January, 2025. The young learners presented their findings based on observation, research and inter disciplinary integration to their parents. Insect-themed riddles added a playful twist to the show, while an action song in Hindi had everyone humming along. An interesting inclusion was the information on 'Entomophagy'—the practice of eating insects. A creative retelling of 'The Ant and the Grasshopper' by the students explored the theme of humanity. The 'Insect Yoga Session', featuring the bug, caterpillar, and bumblebee poses, added elements of creativity and fun. With the integration of AI and Robotics, the students demonstrated a flickering rainbow stick modeled on a firefly.


# Annual Pauline's Day- Pre-Primary Section- Showcasing learning with fun!
